Palestinian partner to visit Northern California UMC churches this month

Ata Manasra from the Palestinian village of Wadi Foquin in the West Bank will visit the California-Nevada Annual Conference Sept. 10–20 for an educational and fundraising speaking tour.

Manasra is the coordinator of the Narjes community development project, a unique Muslim-Christian partnership supported by the UMC General Board of Global Ministries that



assists with economic initiatives and other efforts to help make life sustainable while resisting the Israeli military occupation. He will be sharing information about Wadi Foquin and raising funds for current projects.

Wadi Foquin is a microcosm of all the challenges facing Palestinians under the occupation: Its lands are being annexed for construction of illegal settlements; it lies in the path of Israel's separation wall; access to jobs, schools, hospitals, and markets is restricted by Israeli military checkpoints; and residents are subject to random military raids and threatening incursions into the village by armed settlers. Village leaders have chosen to resist nonviolently by remaining in Wadi Foquin and investing in projects that promote hope, pride, and practical life skills for the residents, particularly the young people.

The United Methodist Church calls for Israel to end the occupation, land confiscations, and the expansion of settlements, which are illegal under international law.
